Respect the animals' habitats and enjoy them peacefully. Any harassment towards an animal or their habitat is hazardous to both you and the animal.




Help preserve the zoo grounds. Stay on pathways and respect animal and plant life. Throw away trash in trash bins or recycle.



The zoo provides special diets for the animals, feeding them other food items could make them sick. Take part in staff guided feeding opportunities such as "Giraffe Encounters" or utilize duck and fish pond feeders.



Keep drones and other motorized flying items as well as fireworks out of the zoo.




Please leave pets of any kind at home. Never leave your pet unattended in a vehicle.

# ENJOY YOUR VISIT!



**I may see people sitting on benches, walking, riding bikes, or scooters. A large old train, called “Two Bits” is stationed at the zoo, and the restrooms are nearby.**



I'm visiting the flamingo and swan pond habitat as well as the Nature Trail.

**In this area, I may see bright pink flamingos, swans, and maybe even native animal visitors such as squirrels, bunnies, and other birds on the Nature Trail.**





**The pond has a viewing dock over it that I can walk out on if I want to.**

**If the flamingos are not outside, I can view them in their indoor habitat.**

**I will not tap or bang on the glass because I do not want to disturb the birds inside.**





The Nature Trail has a concrete path that goes along the pond side near the road, and an internal, mulched path, that goes along the other side of the pond.



I will see bridges, and the walkway may have sunlight flickering through the tree leaves.

I will hear water in the pond and at the waterfall.





The next area I'm visiting is known as "Wild Asia".



**One of the entrances into Wild Asia is a fun archway.  
I can see the words "Wild Asia" and two red panda signs.**


**In Wild Asia, I will see many different types of animals.**

**Sloth bear, cats, goral, cranes, red pandas, sheep, banteng, camels, siamang, and more!**





**It is important that I stay on the designated paths and stay off and behind fences.**



**There is an elevated boardwalk path above Wild Asia. It goes over the sloth bear habitat and leads to another area of the zoo.**

**The boardwalk has both stairs and a ramp for entry.**

**I will travel safely on this path and use the handrails if I need to.**



**I may notice new smells when I walk by some of the habitats.**




**Some of the animals can make very loud noises.**

**This is okay, this is how they communicate. They are safe, and so am I.**

The “Animals of the Night” building is home to nocturnal species (animals that are awake at night and sleep during the day).

Inside the building, it is very dark, and the lights are red.

It is important that I keep my voice quiet and not hit or bang on the glass.



My eyes may need time to adjust while going in and out of this dark space.



**There are shaded areas with benches where I can stop and rest if I need to.**




I may see signs that tell me how to be safe when visiting or signs that give more information about the zoo or the animals.


**Staff Entrance Only**





**I may see zoo staff working in or around habitats. I may see and hear mowers or other tools in use. Staff members can tell me more about the zoo and the animals, or assist me if I need help.**





**The playground area is very popular and may have a lot of visitors. I may hear a lot of talking, laughter, shouting, and other loud noises.**

**There is a slide and various climbing structures to enjoy. Some of the structures may be dark as I climb through or under them. The mulch in this area is made of recycled tires. It may feel a little squishy to walk on.**



**Restroom areas are nearby if I need them.**



**The West Green area has a lot of lawn space.**

**There are picnic shelters and a gazebo for guests to enjoy.**

**I may see and hear other people in this area as zoo guests share this space.**

Once I finish these areas I can return to the zoo entrance, or I can visit another area in the zoo.
